How to wash with Soap and Water		
1. Remove excess jewellery		
2. Wet hands with warm water		
3. Apply appropriate soap (enough to cover all surfaces of hands)		
4. Rub hands together vigorously to distribute over palms, back of hands, between fingers and wrists		
5. Rinse hands under running water, turn off tap allowing water to drip from fingertips		
6. Thoroughly pat dries hands and wrists with paper towel		
7. Dispose of paper towel		
How to use Hand Rub		
1. Remove excess jewellery		
2. Squirt product into cupped hands (enough to cover all surfaces of hands)		
3. Roll to distribute over palms, back of hands, between fingers and wrists		
4. Rub hands together until all surfaces are dry
